DETAIL OF THE SUBMISSION

1. OBJECTIVE

1.1 The objective is to issue the PCC's precept for 2022/23.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Schedule 5 of the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011 sets out the process for issuing a precept, including the Police and Crime Panel's (the Panel) role in reviewing the proposed precept, its power to veto the precept and the steps to be taken if it does.
- 2.2 The Home Office has also issued detailed guidance which supports this process including reporting requirements, the process for PCP scrutiny and the key (statutory) dates by which the various stages must be completed.
- 2.3 The 2022/23 budget, precept options and the Medium-Term Financial Plan (MTFP) are all set out in the 'Proposed Precept for 2022/23 Report to the Norfolk PCP 1 February 2022' (the Budget Report). The Report can be found on the PCC's website.

3. AREAS FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 The Budget Report outlines the budget and financial impact of the 2022/23 precept option on which the PCC consulted in January 2022 together with the Medium-Term Financial Plan for the 4 years to 2025/26.
- 3.2 The option was:
 - To increase council tax by £9.99 per annum at Band D (3.59%).

NB Increases of £10 or more would trigger a local referendum 63% of households in Norfolk are below Band D

- 3.3 There were 942 responses to the consultation. 49% of respondents said they were prepared to pay more for policing in Norfolk.
 - A total of 463 said they strongly agreed or agreed with the precept proposal
- 3.4 A high level summary of the option is set out in the table below.

- 3.5 A precept increase, equal to 15 pence per week for a Band B property or 17 pence per week at Band D, will allow the Constabulary to keep their current levels of service in the face of increasing demands and tackle the new challenges that we are facing.
- 3.6 The Constabulary will appoint 21 new officer and staff posts for the next financial year, 19 of them would work in the areas of sexual assault and domestic abuse as these are areas of significant growth in demand for the constabulary. It is imperative to support victims of these crimes and bring perpetrators to justice.
- 3.7 The Budget Report also includes:
 - Details of the Known/Expected Changes funded and included in the budget and MTFP Appendices B(ii)
 - A summary of the savings identified in the budget (Appendix B(iii))
 - Capital Strategy and Capital Programme 2022/26 (Appendix D & E)
 - Reserves Strategy and Forecast Movements (Appendix F)
 - Annual Treasury Management Strategy including Prudential Code Indicators 2022/23 including the borrowing limits (Appendix G)
 - The Minimum Revenue Provision Statement
 - The 2022/23 Precept to be levied on the collection authorities for 2022/23 (Appendix H).

4. OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

- 4.1 No other options were viable to ensure that there was sufficient funding available to the support for the PCC's role to provide an efficient and effective police force.
- 4.2 The PCC proposed the above option of an increase to the Panel
- 4.3 The Norfolk Police and Crime Panel considered, and supported, the PCC's proposal at its meeting on 1 February 2022.

5. STRATEGIC AIMS/OBJECTIVE SUPPORTED

5.1 The strategic aim is to ensure the relevant level of funding to ensure an effective and efficient police force.
