Dear Member of public,

Freedom of Information Request FOI/OPCCN/223

I am writing in connection with your email dated 2023, in which you requested the following information:

"I wanted to ask for data, between 2019 and 2022/23 for

- 1. If the accounts were published in those years
- 2. Number of people who inspected the accounts in the time periods each year.
- 3. Number of requests/questions asked, and what they were/what areas they covered
- 4. Number of objections raised, and what they were.
- 5. Any FOI requests relating to the accounts or finances (with the phrase 'accounts' of 'inspection or statement of accounts')
- 6. Any changes made to the accounts as a result.

There's some data for Lambeth here from 2018/19 that illustrates what I'm looking for https://www.lambeth.gov.uk/about-council/transparency-open-data/inspection-accounts.
If any of the data are already public or if you need further clarification, please let me know. "

I have reviewed our records and can advise the following:

Internal Review

If you are dissatisfied in any way with our response or the way we have handled your request, you can contact us by phone, email or in writing. We may, in the first instance, try and resolve your complaint informally. However, at any stage you can request or we may decide to treat your complaint formally under our internal review process.

An internal review is conducted by the Chief Executive who will review the request and response, taking account of your complaint(s), and will respond in writing as soon as possible. The Information Commissioner's Office recommends that a response should be made in 20 working days. If we are unable to respond in this timeframe, we will inform you and provide a date by which you should expect to receive our response.
