Summary:

- 1. The WONDER Project has been running in Norfolk and delivered by St Giles Trust under the current Contract since 1st March 2018. During this time there have been three contract extensions.
- 2. The WONDER Project supports women in Norfolk by way of a Whole System Approach by rehabilitating female offenders and supporting women at risk of offender.
- 3. The service is diversionary in approach (whereby women given a conditional caution or other women who voluntarily self-refer to the scheme) and targeting intervention for qualifying female offenders, and women at risk of entering the Criminal Justice System.
- 4. The outcome of WONDER is delivery of a community based holistic system of gender specific assessment, referral, and support to meet the complex needs of this vulnerable client group.
- 5. This Decision Notice is to award St Giles Trust a one-off payment of £15,000 to support clients within the WONDER service who have experienced unprecedented deprivation which has been further impacted by the cost-of-living crisis.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the PCC support the WONDER Project delivered by St Giles Trust by way of funding a one-off sum of £15,000.

Detail of the submission

- 1. Objective:
- 1.1 The WONDER Project supports women in Norfolk by way of a Whole System Approach by rehabilitating female offenders and supporting women at risk of offender.
- 1.2 This Decision Notice is to award St Giles Trust a one-off payment of £15,000 to support clients within the WONDER service who have experienced unprecedented deprivation which has been further impacted by the cost-of-living crisis.
- 2. Background:
- 2.1 The WONDER+ service is a Whole System Approach (WSA) to rehabilitating female offenders and supporting women at risk of offending, originally funded by the Ministry of Justice, the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner, Norfolk County Council Public Health and the Norfolk and Suffolk Community Rehabilitation Company (NSCRC).
- 2.2 The current model is now funded by the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner, Norfolk County Council Public Health, and St Giles Trust.
- 2.3 The outcome will be the delivery of a community based holistic system of gender specific assessment, referral, and support to meet the complex needs of this vulnerable client group.
- 2.4 The service targets all women residing in Norfolk who meet the following criteria:
 - Aged 18 years or over and residing in the Norfolk local authority area, or of no fixed abode, presenting in Norfolk and:

- Detention or attendance by appointment at Police Investigation Centres (PICs) in Wymondham, Kings Lynn, Aylsham, Great Yarmouth, and Bury St Edmunds, or
- Engaging with Operational Policing Teams and/or agencies based in Early Help Hubs across the county, or
- In receipt of support from another statutory or voluntary agency but requiring more specialist support in relation to offending behaviour or engagement with the criminal justice system.

3. Areas for consideration:

3.1 Not to fund this one-off payment to support client cost through the service. This was rejected as it would further disadvantage clients caught in the cost of living crisis and further impact upon this group of vulnerable women who in many cases have also been exploited into criminality and found themselves entering the criminal justice system and as a victim of exploitation.

- 5.1 The PCC has a statutory obligation to set out Police and Crime objectives through the Police, Crime and Community Safety Plan 2022-2024. The PCC's six priorities fall into the following categories each with detailed objectives in the plan:

 - Visible and Trusted Policing
 - Tackling Crime
 - Prevent Offending
 - Support Victims
 - Safe and Stronger Communities
- 5.2 The NIDAS service supports three of these pillars: Prevent Offending, Supporting Victims and Safe and Stronger Communities.

- 6.1 The cost of this one-off payment of £15,000 will be from the Commissioning Core budget and will be paid by 31st March 2024.
