

# Subject: Contract Extension To Victim Support For The Norfolk And Suffolk Victim Care Service (NSVC)

# Summary:

- 1. This paper seeks approval from the Police and Crime Commissioner for the extension of the Victims of Crime contract with Victim Support at a cost of £168,876 to Norfolk for the period 1<sup>st</sup> April to 30<sup>th</sup> September 2025.
- 2. The contract commenced in April 2020 for a period of 3 years with the option to extend for 2 years taken in 2023.
- 3. A procurement process is underway to recommission the service from 1<sup>st</sup> October 2025 and is being managed by 7 Force Commercial Services.

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Police and Crime Commissioner grants approval to extend the contract with Victim Support for a period of 6 months, as outlined in this report.

#### Detail of the submission

# 1. Objective:

- 1.1 Since 2015, Police and Crime Commissioners have been responsible for commissioning victim assessment referral services for their force areas, utilising grant funding from the Ministry of Justice (MOJ).
- 1.2 The availability of an assessment and referral service is an entitlement set out in the Victims Code of Practice.
- 1.3 The PCCs for Norfolk and Suffolk co-commission 'Norfolk and Suffolk Victim Care', which is the victim assessment, support, and referral service for victims of crime in both counties. The service is currently delivered by Victim Support, in partnership with the Offices of the Police and Crime Commissioners for Norfolk and Suffolk.

#### 2. Background:

- 2.1 The Victims of Crime Care Service for the populations of Norfolk and Suffolk contract was originally commissioned in April 2020 for a period of 3 years and extended for 2 years in 2023. Decisions 2019/59 and 06/2023 refers.
- 2.2 The OPCC commissioning leads in Norfolk and Suffolk have proposed an extension of six months to the current contract to allow sufficient time for a procurement process and mobilisation.
- 2.3 In agreeing to this extension, Victim Support will: maintain the current monitoring and reporting requirements and staff structure of the service; support the transition of standard risk domestic abuse cases to new provision (once commissioned) and develop a plan to support transition of the service to the new specification by 1<sup>st</sup> October 2025.

#### 3. Areas for consideration:

3.1 The costs for the delivery of this service has been met through the Ministry of Justice Victims' Service Grant Award to the PCC

#### 4. Other options considered:

4.1 Continuation with the incumbent supplier has been agreed as the preferred route with the commissioning leads. For that reason, alternative routes to market have not been explored in detail.

#### 5. Strategic aims/objective supported:

- 5.1 The extension of the current contract supports the Police and Crime Commissioners responsibility for commissioning a victim assessment and referral service to ensure availability and provision across the county as set out in the Victims Code of Practice.
- 5.2 This service also supports the priority within the Police and Crime Plan 2022-2024 of Supporting Victims.

### 6. Financial and other resource implications:

- 6.1 The original 3-year contract value was £1,889,946 and was jointly funded by Norfolk and Suffolk on a 50/50 basis. The cost of the 2-year extension period was £1,274,919 funded on the same basis.
- 6.2 The cost for the proposed 6-month extension is £337,752 requiring £168,876 to be funded from Norfolk. This represents a 5% increase on the budget for this year (2024/25) and includes provision for: salary inflation, increased travel, and accurate reflection of office costs. The budget for volunteer costs has been removed.
- 6.3 The cost for the delivery of this service has been met through the Ministry of Justice Victims' Service Grant Award to the PCC
