1.1 To award crime and disorder reduction grants to support two Voluntary and Community Sector (VCS) organisations.

2.1 The PCC, using the power to award crime and disorder reduction grants, is making a direct award of grants to two organisations totalling £2,570.09 to support her Police and Crime Plan objectives.

- 3.1 The PCC, utilising the power to award crime and disorder reduction grants, is making a direct award of grants to two organisations, totalling £2,570.09.
- 3.2 The grant award for the Geldeston Carpet Bowls Club is based on their application to the Police Property Fund Grant Round and approved based on the club's contribution to building communities where everyone feels secure, valued, and supported.
- 3.3 The decision to award the grant to the Sprowston Youth Project is based on a direct request from young people who are supported by the organisation as a contribution to their user designed cycle track and outdoor space.
