Detail of the submission

1. Objective:

- 1.1 To support and enhance the delivery of the Independent Custody Visiting (ICV) Scheme in Norfolk. Every PCC has a statutory duty to implement and manage an ICV Scheme.

2. Background:

- 2.1 The Independent Custody Visiting Association (ICVA) is a Company Limited by Guarantee that promotes the custody visiting process nationally through advocacy, training, publicity, and ongoing support to all involved in the process.
- 2.2 By subscribing to the ICVA's services for 2025/26, they will on the Schemes behalf:
 - Continue to collaborate with national stakeholders and, as part of the National Preventive Mechanism, meet the UK's international duties. They will continue their core work to lead, support, and represent schemes, providing a national voice for independent custody visiting.
 - Provide representation for independent custody visiting in the National Police Chiefs' Council (NPCC) National Custody Forum meetings and workstreams to influence national policy in police custody.
 - Continue to produce bitesize training modules as straight-to-ICV formats, saving Scheme Manager resources and bringing national learning to local training plans.
 - Develop a new members website for schemes across the country to share resources, ask questions of their peers and keep abreast of developments in custody visiting.
 - Develop an E-Learning platform for Independent Custody Visitors, with interactive and engaging training that scheme managers can allocate, monitor progress and ensure compliance with local training requirements.
 - Develop a national reporting tool for Independent Custody Visitors and schemes to eliminate paper forms, provide national consistency of reporting, and enhance schemes abilities to report in a timely way on the findings of Independent Custody Visitor visits.
 - Provide policy guidance and regular communication via ICVA's weekly newsletter.
 - Provide access to a National Expert Forum to share practice, learning, resources and conduct joint projects.
 - Provide representation for PCCs in the Ministerial deaths in custody board meeting and workstreams.
 - Where schemes visit terrorism detention or may have detainees suspected of terrorism held in their custody suites, access to ICVA's TACT (Terrorism Act)

Network and meetings that bring schemes together to resolve challenges, identify issues and report to the Independent Reviewer of Terrorism Legislation.

- Provide access to the Scheme Managers' Conference, with presentations from top professionals, training, and an opportunity to meet with other Scheme Managers.
- Provide access to the annual ICV National Conference to invest in and thank volunteers.
- Provide national guidance on data collection during visits.

3. Areas for consideration:

3.1 The cost of subscribing to ICVA for 2026/27 is £1,750 plus VAT.

4.1 There are no other options for consideration as ICVA is the only association that provides these services to support independent custody visiting.
