RE: Freedom of Information Request FOI/OPCCN/268

I am writing in connection with your email dated 10th July 2026, in which you requested the following information:

- **Do you commission a service to support women who have experienced sexual exploitation and/or who are involved in the sex industry?**
- **If yes:**
 - **How much funding is provided?**
 - **Is this funded via a particular funding stream?**
 - **Is the funding specifically for support for those who have experienced sexual exploitation and/or who are involved in the sex industry, or is this part of a wider service (e.g. a sexual assault service that also supports those who have experienced sexual exploitation)?**

I have reviewed our records and can advise the following:

We do not commission a service that has this specific remit; however we do commission services that support survivors of sexual violence and abuse as part of a wider service. This can include sexual exploitation.

- Sue Lambert Support – practical and therapeutic support – Ministry of Justice funding £145,000 for period April 2026 to end March 2027.
- Brave Futures – therapeutic support for children aged 11 – 18 affected by childhood sexual abuse or sexual exploitation. Support up to age 21 (or age 25 for people with learning difficulties) for young people already in the service. Funding from core commissioning budget £120,000 for period April 2026 to end March 2028.

- One to one project – counselling for people age 18 and over affected by sexual violence or abuse in West and North Norfolk – funding from core commissioning budget £72,802 for 18-month period April 2026 to end June 2028.
- Daisy Programme - counselling for people age 18 and over affected by sexual violence or abuse in Breckland area – funding from core commissioning budget £70,200 for 18-month period April 2026 to end June 2028.

If you are dissatisfied in any way with our response or the way we have handled your request, you can contact us by phone, email or in writing. We may, in the first instance, try and resolve your complaint informally. However, at any stage you can request, or we may decide to treat your complaint formally under our internal review process.

An internal review is conducted by the Chief Executive who will review the request and response, taking account of your complaint(s), and will respond in writing as soon as possible. The Information Commissioner's Office recommends that a response should be made in 20 working days. If we are unable to respond in this timeframe, we will inform you and provide a date by which you should expect to receive our response.
